Areas of Interest

If you plan to spend additional time in Arkansas, below are a few possible places to visit:

- **Little Rock's River Market District** is located in the heart of Little Rock. Transportation is made easy on three replica vintage trolleys operating on the 2.5-mile route. The Market is full of unique shops selling everything from bath and body goods to antique furniture to pieces of art. And don't forget to visit the "little rock" on the Arkansas River, while your there.
- **The Clinton Library and Museum** is located within the Clinton Presidential Center and Park next to the Arkansas River in Little Rock. The archival and museum holdings at the Clinton Presidential Library & Museum are the largest within the Presidential Library system.
- **The Old State House Museum**, a Greek Revival style dating back to 1836, overlooks the Arkansas River in Little Rock. It is set in the oldest surviving state capitol west of the Mississippi River, and is designated a National Historic Landmark.
- **Historic Arkansas Museum** invites you to come in and step back into Arkansas frontier history. Tour the museum's historic grounds and visit a [pre-civil war](#) neighborhood, including the oldest home still standing in Little Rock and the site where William Woodruff once printed the Arkansas Gazette
- **Pinnacle Mountain State Park** is just outside and west of Little Rock. Pinnacle Mountain, jutting 1,011 feet above the Arkansas River, has been a natural landmark for centuries and is one of seven peaks of the Ouachita Mountain Range within this 2,069-acre park. These represent only a portion of the diverse habitat protected at the park. This day-use park is known for its [hiking trails](#) and panoramic views.
- **Hot Springs, Arkansas** is 50 minutes from Little Rock. The first federally protected area in the nation's history, Hot Springs National Park Arkansas, features amazing 147° thermal water, rich history and beautiful architecture. Enjoy gorgeous [Arkansas hiking trails](#) in the Ouachita Mountains, tour the historic Fordyce Bathhouse and Visitor's Center, or enjoy a relaxing [Hot Springs spa](#) - all in the historic downtown area of Hot Springs.
- The **Buffalo National River** is about 2-3 hours from Little Rock; this unique river is known for its spectacular bluffs, wilderness hiking trails, elk herds, camping, and canoeing (you will have to go to the middle reaches or lower during September, unless there is a big rain).
- **Blanchard Springs Caverns** is about 2.5 hours from Little Rock and is one of the most spectacular caves in the country. The **Ozark Folk Center and Mountain View, AR**, near Blanchard Springs Caverns, are famous for "Ozark mountain crafts and music."
