Workshop Site

The workshop will be held at the **University of Arkansas Center for Continuing Education (CCE)**. The CCE is located at 2 East Center Street just west of Fayetteville's historic downtown square. Lodging

The newly built **Staybridge Suites Hotel** is located near the workshop site and is about 10 minutes by car from the CCE building. A block of Studio Suites (includes queen bed, kitchenette and complimentary breakfast each morning) are available for attendees at a special rate of \$89 per night or \$72 with Gov't I.D. plus applicable taxes. Take exit 62 (University of Arkansas Exit).

Travel east on 6th Street 2 miles to School Avenue.

Turn left and travel north 1 mile to Center Street.

Turn left on Center Street - CCE is located on the NE corner of Center and N. East Avenue.

Areas of Interest: If you plan to spend additional time in North Arkansas, below are a few possible places to visit:

- Historic **Eureka Springs, AR** is approximately 45 minutes from Fayetteville; this quaint village is known for its beautiful architecture, Ozark arts & crafts, B&Bs, and natural springs.
- Near Eureka Springs is the **Kings River**, which is known nationally for its small mouth bass fisheries; canoeing services and fishing guides are available.
- The upper reaches of the **Buffalo National River** are within 1.5 hours of Fayetteville; this unique river is known for its spectacular bluffs, wilderness hiking trails, elk herds, camping, and canoeing (you will have to go to the middle reaches or lower during the Fall, unless there is a big rain).
- Other sites fairly close to Fayetteville include: **Civil War battlefields; Beaver Lake; White River below Beaver Lake** (introduced trout fisheries); and more.
- And if you don't mind a very long drive, at least 4 hours from Fayetteville, visit **Blanchard Springs Caverns**, one of the most spectacular caves in the country, and the **Ozark Folk Center and Mountain View, AR**, which is an area famous for its "Ozark mountain music and local crafts."
- Also, depending on the weather, you may still see some spectacular Ozark fall colors, especially, around Fayetteville.
- The famous architect, **E. Fay Jones**, taught, practiced, and lived in Fayetteville and there are many of his structures in the area.
